

**HILLSBORO CITY COUNCIL MEETING**  
**Hillsboro Municipal Court – 130 Homestead Drive**

**December 14, 2015**

**CITY COUNCIL**

At 7:00 p.m., Council President Pro-Tem, Richard Donley, called the Hillsboro City Council meeting to order. The following were present for the meeting: Mayor Drew Hastings, Todd Wilkin, Safety and Service Director; Gary Lewis, Auditor; Fred Beery, Law Director; and Debbie Sansone, Clerk.

Mr. Donley led the council in prayer and Mayor Hastings led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**ROLL CALL**

Tracy Aranyos, Dick Donley, Justin Harsha, Ann Morris, and Becki Wilkin were present.

**MOTION** Mr. Donley moved, seconded by Ms. Aranyos, to excuse the absence Mr. Koogler (illness), Mr. Alexander (death in family), and Ms. Klein (illness).  
Vote: all yeas. Council excused their absence.

**MINUTES**

There were no additions or corrections to the minutes from the Regular Meeting on November 9, 2015. Council approved the minutes as written.

**MONTHLY REPORTS**

There were no questions about the November 2015 monthly reports and the Clerk read the reports by title only: Auditor, Income Tax Bureau, Police, Public Utilities, Street, Wastewater Treatment, Water Meter, Water/Sewer Maintenance, and Water Treatment.

**COMMUNICATIONS**

No communications

**CITIZENS' COMMENTS**

Many citizens were present for the meeting to protest a Facebook posting by Mayor Hastings. Mr. Donley asked everyone to keep their comments to approximately three minutes and to step forward in order for the recorder to pick up their voice. Jaymara Captain spoke first to state that as a person of color, she was appalled and outraged by the Mayor's comments and Council should hold him accountable. She called for the Mayor's resignation.

Rodney Captain related that he and his wife recently dealt with some issues at school regarding the sports program. Sports are relative to life and build character. He said everyone has a choice and can be part of the problem or part of the solution and Mayor

Hastings needs to make the right decision to lead the community into a different direction.

Mr. Donley said that there were a lot of people who want to comment and most of the comments will be about the Facebook posting and they are good comments but he did not believe there would be time for everyone to comment. He asked Steven Williams to speak next and unless someone had something different to address that would be all the public comment. Ms. Captain said that Council needed to be respectful and hear all the comments. Everyone chimed in that their comments should be heard.

Steven Williams related the events of the Facebook posting and initially was forgiving that the Mayor made a mistake until he saw what he considered to be a history of comments over the last four years. He said that Hillsboro was disrespected and disgraced by their mayor and Council has enabled him by accepting him. He asked for censure for the Mayor's actions. Mr. Williams related the problems in Hillsboro sixty-five years ago to integrate the schools and felt that Council did not grasp "it." He asked for a formal review of the Mayor because an apology is not enough. Ms. Wilkin said that she did not follow Facebook and did not know about the comments.

Barb Cole, resident and candidate for County Commissioner, asked Mr. Donley to allow everyone to speak, that there is nothing Council has to do that is more important than to hear everyone's comments.

James Matticks addressed Chief Whited asking if Drew Hastings or Todd Wilkin ever asked him to do anything that was illegal. Mr. Donley interrupted stating it was a Council meeting and not a question and answer period. Ms. Captain said she was confused by the lack of communication between Council and the Mayor.

Mr. Donley said that everyone is individually elected and the Administration is separate from the Council. Council passes legislation and does not control the Mayor's office.

Ariana Jackson spoke on good and evil, as a Prophet of the Lord, and said that Jesus said that a house of government divided against itself cannot stand. She said that Council refuses to go against "your own kind" and quoted many scriptures then asked for the Administration to resign.

Mr. Harsha said that this was the first Council meeting since the Mayor's comments on Facebook. The proper course of action is to place the matter in the Employee Relations Committee and see what Council can do about it.

Mr. Donley was forced to take control of the meeting. Ms. Jackson continued to speak.

Lewis Williams spoke, representing the Baptist Church. He said that in 1954 he was in the march for integration of the schools in Hillsboro, stating that racism is ugly and that everyone should be equal. He asked that Drew offer a public apology to everyone, not just the ones present at Council, but everyone in the City of Hillsboro.

Rachel Hudson said it was not all right to hold office and make the comments he made. He has a responsibility to the city, he was wrong, and his apology was not sincere and she would not accept an apology.

Quinn Moorman, recent citizen of Hillsboro, asked his son if he has declared war on the Mayor. His son said “no.” Mr. Moorman said the Mayor has opened the door for a revolution.

Derrick Haithcock said racism is racism and the Mayor should be held accountable for his actions. He said to the crowd that everyone needs to come to the meetings more often and need to “speak up” and take more of a stand. He asked the Mayor to step down.

Craig Jackson, City of Hillsboro employee, said that he is called “nigger” once or twice every week on the job and now the Mayor’s comments have put him in an unsafe work environment. He said he was in the military and protected his country and now who will protect him from the City of Hillsboro and the people who look at him like he was some kind of (inaudible).

Richard Stiffler, Hillsboro citizen, said that the hate needs to quit. He respects all of those who served in the military, regardless of race, who protected him.

Aaron Brown, citizen, spoke up in defense of Mayor Hastings saying that the Mayor is not a racist and that firing him will not solve anything. Mr. Donley once again took control of the crowd stating that everyone has a right to talk.

Brent Burns, who grew up in Hillsboro, said he respected what everyone had to say. He said sometimes words are the worst weapons that cause catastrophic damage. He asked for respect, equal treatment, and justice for all.

Rhonda Captain Cumberland said she would like to see Mayor Hastings step down.

Mr. Harsha said that if the Employee Relations Committee is not where this issue needs to be addressed, maybe a Special Council meeting is needed because it needs to be discussed. Someone asked if a Special Council meeting was Executive Session and Mr. Harsha said that it would be an open meeting.

Angie Williams asked Council to hold the Mayor accountable for his comments on Facebook. If Council does not hold the Mayor accountable for his comments on Facebook, then they have secrets in their closets. Ms. Aranyos offered to talk with Ms. Williams later if there was an implication about her personal life and Facebook. Ms. Williams thanked Mr. Harsha for being open to the idea of looking into the matter further. Mr. Harsha said that any other issue presented to Council is put into committee and this matter is an overwhelming issue that needs to be looked at.

Mr. Matticks stated that he does not live in the city but everyone should know that Ohio ordinance 705.92 gives the right to recall the Mayor. Anyone living in the City of Hillsboro can get the process started.

**COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYOR (Drew Hastings, Mayor)**

Mayor Hastings started his report by saying that for anyone who did not read his apology or did not think it was meaningful, he apologized again. He said that in his last Mayor's report he talked about something that is very important to him, which is the overriding negativity that is sometimes in the city. He said he did not follow his own wisdom. He has always made a point to be positive and in this case he was part of the problem. He apologized for that, apologized to the Black community, and to the entire city of Hillsboro. He also specifically apologized to City Council for having created an unnecessary distraction from their day-to-day work. He said he could not do much more than apologize. There was a collective call from the audience for the Mayor's resignation and Mr. Donley once again called order to the room. He said that everyone had their chance to talk and this was the Mayor's response time. Mayor Hastings said he learned a lesson and would never do it again. When asked, he said the lesson he learned is that at sixty-one years old, when he thought he had all the answers, he does not necessarily have them. That words can be harmful. That being an elected official is a 24-7 job with no private life. He cannot be making jokes or comments and he will always be looked at in a mayoral light. He apologized again to the community.

Mayor Hastings extended condolences to Bill Alexander's family for the passing of Bill's mother.

To get a jump on plans for next year, he met with the Board of Realtors to discuss blight and zoning throughout the city to get the realtors on board with the city's efforts to improve housing and living as it pertains to blight and zoning. He spoke with local banks who are interested in residential living projects and the hotel project.

Council has a budget to approve for 2016 and he looks forward to what can be accomplished with the new budget. He also presented a capital budget request that was sent to the state requesting funds to complete sidewalks to Southern State Community College. He said he saw someone in a motorized wheel chair traveling in the street because there was no sidewalk and finds that to be unacceptable. The City is requesting a revolving loan fund for the sidewalk maintenance program and funds to complete the installation of decorative lights in the Historic district. Mayor Hastings will meet with state representatives next week to make the Capital Budget request.

The Mayor wants to amend the minimum billing and fee structure for water and asked that President Koogler place the issue in the Utilities Committee for discussion.

The Uptown Christmas Parade was a huge success and the Mayor was sorry that he could not attend due to a previous commitment. There was an estimated 5,000 to 6,000 people viewing the parade, which shows people are hungry for events in a revitalized uptown.

He thanked the Hillsboro Uptown Business Associate (HUBA) and Joe Mahan, President of HUBA, for all their hard work.

Mayor Hastings wished everyone a Merry Christmas and hoped that everyone had a great and safe holiday. There were no questions for Mayor Hastings.

Mr. Donley recognized Joe Mahan who wanted to make comments earlier in the meeting. Mr. Mahan began by wishing everyone a Merry Christmas. He said that it is not customary but he wanted to give Council a review of 2015. In April, May, June, August, September, October, November and December, HUBA held First Friday Events which were in the most part very successful. October BOOFEST was held uptown in conjunction with the county Beggar's Night and it was estimated that 2,000 children were uptown during the two-hour event. A Snowflake Pageant was held in November and a Midnight Madness Sale was held on Thanksgiving evening. The Christmas parade was postponed in November. "Shop Small Saturday," sponsored by American Express, was held on November 28 even though the weather was bad. The December "First Friday" was the best-attended "First Friday" event with Santa's Workshop, thanks to the Times Gazette, and a horse and buggy ride, which brought people from out of town. The Christmas Parade had approximately fifty entries for the first lighted nighttime parade and was very successful. Mr. Mahan thanked those people who helped to put up the Christmas wreaths each year. He thanked three council members and the law director who are members of HUBA. He also thanked the media outlets, the county commissioners, the police department, and the City of Hillsboro and Council and the administration staff. He thanked Drew Hastings for allowing a live nativity scene in his building on Governor Trimble. He also asked for volunteers to help with events.

#### **SAFETY AND SERVICE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Mr. Wilkin announced the city employee of the month, Adam Day, Police Department canine handler, and expressed his appreciation for Adam's work and his dedication to the city. He thanked all the city employees for a successful year. Many projects were accomplished and without the hard work of the employees, the projects could not be completed. Mr. Wilkin also thanked Gary Lewis, Auditor, for working hard on the 2016 budget. The 2016 budget includes more infrastructure repair, street paving, zoning regulation updates, and the implementation of the sidewalk program.

The North East Street project is complete but there were problems with the paving that will be resolved within the week. ODOT awarded the city a grant for new traffic light controllers at all intersections and the installation of the program (Inter-Connect) that communicates with the controllers which should improve the flow of traffic. There were no questions for Mr. Wilkin.

#### **AUDITOR'S REPORT (Gary Lewis, Auditor)**

Mr. Lewis presented the year-to-date fund report and year-to-date bank report with a balance of \$6,280,590.19 in various bank accounts and in investments and cash-on-hand for operational purposes. He asked for a motion from Council to accept the report.

**MOTION** Ms. Aranyos moved, seconded by Ms. Wilkin, to accept the Auditor's report. There was no discussion. Vote: all yeas. Council accepted the report.

Mr. Lewis explained the resolutions before Council:

A resolution to increase various appropriations that did not have enough appropriated at the beginning of the year

A resolution to increase appropriation and transfers in the Water Debt Fund to correct an erroneous debt schedule received at the beginning of the year

A resolution to allow the auditor to make various line-item adjustments to reduce appropriations when projected revenue did not match actual receipts

A resolution to allow the auditor to transfer money from fund to fund during 2016

A resolution (ordinance) for the 2016 budget

A resolution to create a new fund and transfer funds for the Municipal Court as required by the Ohio Revised Code

There were no questions for Mr. Lewis.

#### **PLANNING COMMISSION (Mayor Hastings)**

The Planning Commission met at 5:30 p.m. on November 17, 2015 in the Hillsboro Firehouse Community Room. Present for the meeting were Stephen Crouch, Tom Eichinger, Drew Hastings (Mayor), Ruth Robbins, Buck Wilkin (Chair) and Todd Wilkin (SSD). The committee approved the October meeting minutes.

The Commission will contact a zoning consultant to help prepare an RFP to find a consultant to make recommendations for changes to the city zoning codes. The changes are sorely needed and the commission is working quickly to solve the problems.

The Commission moved to recommend an amendment to Historic District G zoning legislation to exclude residential units on the first floor. A public hearing is scheduled for January 11, 2016.

Mr. Crouch informed the Commission of an up-coming seminar on land banks. It will be very informative regarding empty lots and blighted properties and how to get something done with them. Marilyn Hiestand requested a variance for a driveway cut on Willow Street, which the Commission denied for safety and traffic reasons. Robert Skoog, Jr., presented a development idea for multi-unit garden apartments on his father's North High Street properties. He asked the Commission to change the zoning to Residential B. The Commission agreed that it is a good project and asked that Mr. Skoog continue his plans.

No zoning issues will be addressed until the consultant is obtained and a recommendation is received for zoning at that location.

The meeting adjourned at 7:10 p.m. The next regular meeting is December 15, 2015 at 5:30 in the Firehouse Community Room. Mayor Hastings invited everyone to attend the meeting.

There were no questions for Mayor Hastings.

## **STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS**

### **FINANCE COMMITTEE (Dick Donley, Chair)**

The Finance Committee met on November 19, 2015 at the Administration Building. Ann Morris, Bill Alexander, and Dick Donley, Chair, were present for the meeting. Also in attendance were Mayor Hastings, Todd Wilkin, SSD, Gary Lewis, Auditor, Debbie Sansone, Clerk of Council, and Sam Stratman.

The committee discussed and reviewed the proposed 2016 budget. All committee members received a copy of the proposed budget prepared by the Auditor and City Administration. Mr. Lewis stated that the budget reflected a carryover into 2016 of \$667,000 and that he would prefer it to be in the area of \$700,000 to \$750,000. Mr. Wilkin stated that the budget had some increases in the area of streets, improvements to Harry Sauner Road, Blighted buildings and a sidewalk program. There is also a two percent increase in wages for all city employees. The administration anticipates expenses for a zoning consultant, possible Wi-Fi for the uptown area and businesses and to update the city Web site. After the review it was determined that another meeting of the finance committee would be necessary to review line items and make final approval. The meeting adjourned.

On December 10, 2015, the committee met at 5:00 p.m. in the City Administration Building. Ann Morris, Bill Alexander, and Dick Donley, Chair, were present. Also in attendance were Mayor Hastings, Todd Wilkin, SSD; Gary Lewis, Auditor; Lee Koogler, President of Council, and council members Tracy Aranyos, Claudia Klein, Justin Harsha, and Becki Wilkin. Barb Cole and Joe Mahan from the community were also present.

Mr. Lewis was asked for any additional information or concerns about the proposed budget. Mr. Lewis stated he was still concerned about the amount of carryover and requested council and Administration to review some line items to possibly increase the carryover to at least \$700,000. Mr. Koogler asked Mr. Wilkin about the \$30,000 in Professional Services for the Planning Commission. Mr. Wilkin stated they want to acquire a zoning consultant to review the present zoning. Mr. Wilkin stated there are many concerns with the present zoning. He felt that a professional could solve many of those concerns and help with future expansion.

Mr. Koogler also questioned the line items in Miscellaneous General Government. The amounts for legal fees and blighted homes. Mr. Hastings stated that sometimes legal

issues occur that you do not expect and felt that some money should be there and hopefully not used. Mayor Hastings said the amount for blighted property and homes was necessary for improvement to the city. The administration has been working on a partnership with many businesses and property owners and wanted to see that project continue.

After the committee members had their concerns answered, the focus was then to find areas in line items to increase the carryover amount. The Administration offered reductions of \$15,000 from police pension, \$5,000 from the Wi-Fi project, \$7,000 from legal fees and \$7,000 from sidewalk improvements. Administration felt the programs could still be successful. That brought the carryover to over \$700,000 that the auditor requested for 2016.

All members voted to present this proposed budget to full council for approval at the next council meeting. With no other business for the committee, Mr. Alexander moved, seconded by Ms. Morris, to adjourn. The motion passed.

**PROPERTY MAINTENANCE AND RESTORATION (Ann Morris, Chair)**

The Property Maintenance and Restoration Committee met on December 10, 2015 in the City Administration Building to review changes to the current sign ordinance. There were five items reviewed and approved concerning definitions and renderings in an effort to make the ordinance easier to understand. All Council members have the paperwork.

Ms. Morris thanked Mr. Mahan and HUBA for all they do for the city. She encouraged anyone to join HUBA stating that everything that HUBA does is achieved on a very limited budget.

**CIVIL SERVICE AND EMPLOYEE RELATIONS COMMITTEE (William Alexander, Chair)**

**STREET AND SAFETY COMMITTEE (Justin Harsha, Chair)**

No report. Mr. Harsha is waiting for the Festival of the Bells to contact him with a date for their next meeting.

**UTILITIES COMMITTEE (Becki Wilkin, Chair)**

No report. Mr. Donley placed the issue of the minimum water billing and fee structure into the Utilities Committee.

**ZONING AND ANNEXATION COMMITTEE (Tracy Aranyos, Chair)**

**COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT (Claudia Klein, Chair)**

Mr. Donley reported for Ms. Klein. The issue of an Entertainment District was placed in the Community Enhancement Committee to explore the concept of opening the Uptown area to serve cocktails and alcohol to encourage a restaurant of some sort. The

recommendation was to meet with Mr. Koogler and he would provide more information about forming a district.

### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

Mr. Harsha asked what the proper course of action would be to further investigate the comments made by Mayor Hastings on Facebook – a committee meeting or a council meeting? Mr. Beery suggested a committee meeting of the whole, not a council meeting. Mr. Harsha said the Employee Relations Committee is the closest relevant committee. Mr. Beery said it could be heard in that committee but since Council has no real “say” on the matter, what committee do you put it in? Mr. Beery said he could answer legal questions and prepare Mr. Harsha for the meeting. It is whatever Mr. Harsha would like to do. Mr. Donley clarified that anyone from Council can request a Committee of the Whole and it does not need to be a specific committee. Mr. Beery said he could answer questions from Council but not “questions-at-large.” Mr. Harsha said perhaps it is a conversation he should have with Mr. Koogler. Mr. Donley suggested waiting until the first of the year because of holiday schedules.

Mr. Donley asked Mr. Mahan and Jason Grove if they would serve on the Local Board of Tax Review. Both agreed to serve. The Mayor appointed Debbie Sansone as an interim appointee until the Mayor receives answers from other possible appointees.

**MOTION** Ms. Morris moved, seconded by Ms. Wilkin, to approve and adopt Resolution No. 15-46. There was no further discussion. Vote: all yeas. Council approved and adopted the resolution.

- **Resolution No. 15-47** A Resolution to Appoint Members to the Shade Tree Commission as Provided in Hillsboro City Code of Ordinance (Section 32.75) *Introduced by the Safety and Service Director*

**MOTION** Ms. Aranyos moved, seconded by Ms. Morris, to approve and adopt Resolution No. 15-47. There was no further discussion. Vote: all yeas. Council approved and adopted the resolution.

- **Ordinance No. 2015-08** An Ordinance to Amend Chapter 35 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Hillsboro Regarding Municipal Income Tax *Introduced by the Tax Commissioner*

**MOTION** Ms. Wilkin moved, seconded by Ms. Morris, to read the ordinance by Title Only. There was no further discussion. Vote: all yeas. The ordinance was read by Title Only.

**MOTION** Ms. Aranyos moved, seconded by Ms. Morris, to suspend the Three Reading Rule. There was no further discussion. Vote: all yeas. The Three Reading Rule was suspended.

**MOTION** Ms. Aranyos moved, seconded by Ms. Morris, to approve and adopt Ordinance No. 2015-08. There was no further discussion. Vote: all yeas. Council approved and adopted the ordinance.

- **Ordinance No. 2015-09** An Ordinance to Amend the Sign Ordinance to Provide for Fee Changes and Additional Sign Options *Introduced by the Property Maintenance and Restoration Committee.* The ordinance was given its First Reading.

Mr. Harsha said there was conversation about having no permit requirement to repair or paint existing signs. He searched an ordinance from another city and found an ordinance that stated “no permit is required for repair, repainting, or other maintenance that does not alter a sign.” He would like the verbiage added to the Hillsboro sign ordinance. Mr. Beery asked Mr. Harsha to let him know how he wanted the ordinance to read and he will amend it. Mayor Hastings asked for clarification and Ms. Morris explained that it referred to maintenance only of an existing sign. Mayor Hastings thought it would be confusing to read, “No permit needed” in the ordinance and he did not want people to get the wrong impression. Currently there is no permit needed to maintain a sign and he believed added language would lead people to think that it applied to other areas. Mr. Harsha believed it would clarify the interpretation of “repair.” Mr. Wilkin said he has never seen the scenario that a permit was required to paint or replace a light bulb. Ultimately, if a permit was submitted but was not required, the owner would be notified. Ms. Morris suggested that the extra language not be added and when the sign owner inquired about a permit, they would be told they do not need one. Mr. Donley said this is the first reading and there is time to discuss it.

- **Ordinance No. 2015-10** An Ordinance to Make Appropriations for Current Expenses and Other Expenditures of the City of Hillsboro, State of Ohio, during the Fiscal Year Ending December 31, 2016 *Introduced by the Auditor*

Mr. Donley explained that the budget was reviewed in the Finance Committee twice and all council members have a copy. The ordinance must be passed by the end of the year.

**MOTION** Ms. Aranyos moved, seconded by Ms. Morris, to suspend the Three Reading Rule. There was no further discussion. Vote: all yeas. The Three Reading Rule was suspended.

**MOTION** Ms. Aranyos moved, seconded by Ms. Wilkin, to approve and adopt Ordinance No. 2015-10. There was no further discussion. Vote: all yeas.  
Council adopted Ordinance No. 2015-10.

**NEW BUSINESS**

No new business.
